



Ogden City Council votes against process steps resolution

OGDEN, UTAH (Jan. 24, 2007) — After accepting feedback from residents through scores of e-mail, telephone and face-to-face conversations during the last couple of months and after hearing from several residents at the Jan. 23 Ogden City Council meeting, the Council voted against adopting a resolution that would have defined its expectations for a possible urban gondola, mountain resort and hillside development project.

Many on the Council said at the meeting that they would like to receive more specific information regarding the potential project before finalizing what the process steps for considering such a project would be.

Council Chair Jesse Garcia said he believes it was a good idea to not act on the resolution at this time, but added that the work done to define the process could prove to be a valuable asset in the future.

“We have the process steps in place, so if a proposal ever comes we will know how to proceed.”

The Council has not received word from project developer Chris Peterson regarding when a formal proposal might be submitted.

The process steps resolution was first presented in November 2006. At that time, the Council deemed it wise to wait to vote on it until Jan. 23, 2007 in order to have the opportunity to receive feedback from residents.
