



## Halloween Safety

Plan costumes that are bright and reflective. Make sure shoes fit well and costumes are short enough to prevent tripping, entanglement, or contact with flame. A parent or responsible adult should *always* accompany young children trick-or-treating through neighborhoods.

- Use a flashlight to see and be seen by others.
- Stay in groups.
- Always tell someone where you are going.
- Only go to homes with porch lights on.
- Remain on well-lit streets and always use the sidewalk.
- If no sidewalk is available, walk at the farthest edge of the roadway facing traffic.
- Never cut across yards and do not use alleys.
- Never enter a stranger's home or car for a treat.
- Obey all traffic and pedestrian regulations.
- Always walk; never run across a street.
- Only cross the street as a group in established crosswalks.
- Remove any mask or item that will limit eyesight before crossing a street or driveway.
- Don't assume the right of way. Motorists may have trouble seeing trick-or-treaters. Just because one car stops, doesn't mean others will!
- No treats are to be eaten until thoroughly checked by an adult at home.
- Call police to report anything suspicious.



## Make Your Vote Count on November 5



We have the power to shape the community in which we live. The City of Ogden is governed by a Mayor-Council

form of government, meaning we have a full-time Mayor and a part-time City Council.

The Mayor-Council form of government follows the national constitutional framers' ideals of "separation of powers" and "balance of power" which provides for separate, independent and equal branches of government.

While our Mayor has administrative authority and executive responsibility for the day-to-day operations of the City, our City Council has legislative responsibilities to approve municipal laws and adopt the City's budget.

### Citizens have three ways to vote

1. **Early Voting:** Avoid long lines by voting early. Cast your vote at the Municipal Building, 2549 Washington Blvd., Ste. 210, from 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Oct. 22 through Nov. 1.
2. **Election Day Voting:** Nov. 5 from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. Find your polling location at [vote.utah.gov](http://vote.utah.gov) or take advantage of three new city-wide vote centers that service all registered voters regardless of their assigned polling location: Ogden-Weber Applied Technology College at 200 Washington Blvd., Union Station at 2501 Wall Ave, and Dee Events Center at 4450 Harrison Blvd.
3. **Absentee Voting by Mail:** Any registered voter who anticipates being absent for the election may request an absent-voter ballot at [www.elections.utah.gov](http://www.elections.utah.gov) or by calling the Weber County Election office at 801-399-7411.

to fill four City Council seats, members who will represent Municipal Wards 1 and 3 and At-Large seats A and B. The City Council is composed of seven members, four of whom represent municipal wards or districts, and three who are elected at-large by all Ogden voters. All hold four year terms.

Ogden City Council members carry out the following duties: approve City policies and ordinances, approve City general plans, approve property zoning, rezoning, annexations, vacations, and inter-local agreements, determine appropriate levels of City service, approve annual City budgets, provide advice and consent for appointments to City positions, conduct reviews of City administrative actions, and participate in several boards and committees, including both the RDA (Redevelopment Agency) and MBA (Municipal Building Authority) boards.

Plan to vote in the upcoming Municipal election for leaders who represent your values and share your vision for our community.

## Charter Signing Establishes Ongoing Partnership

With a charter signing on Oct. 1, Ogden City and Weber State University officially formalize their ongoing partnership toward building a college town. The City and University have been collaborating for more than one year to foster a stronger bond between WSU and Ogden, and the charter provides a structure to sustain continued relationships and establish working committees to coordinate efforts.

The charter focuses on proactive efforts within our community and collaborating together to make Ogden an even better place to live, work, learn, and play. Anticipated results of the charter will bring a greater Weber State presence to the downtown Ogden area and likewise will bring Ogden residents to the Weber State campus.

## Cleaning Up the Fall Leaves



For many of us, the changing of the color of the leaves in the fall is a much anticipated event.

However, the inevitable raking of the leaves is an experience almost all of us dread.

Be aware as you rake leaves this fall that it is a violation of Illegal Dumping and Waterway Blocking ordinances to sweep or push leaves into the gutter or onto the street.

Fallen leaves can plug storm drains and as the weather freezes will cause ice dams to form in the gutters. Please be a good neighbor and citizen by

keeping the gutter in front of your home clean.

Dispose of green waste from seasonal yard cleanup such as branches, leaves, and grass clippings at Ogden City's Green Waste Facility—1845 Monroe Blvd, 801-629-8271.

Curbside leaf collection is not provided by the City; residents who are unable to take their leaves to the Green Waste Facility should consider asking relatives or friends to assist them. The City's Public Ways and Parks division will however assist elderly or handicapped residents with a one-time bagged leaf pickup service; call 801-629-8271 to schedule assistance.
