Fireworks Safety

Plan for safe holiday celebrations if you wish to use fireworks. Practice these safety guidelines and report any illegal or suspicious activity.

Throughout the summer, fire department staff will assess conditions and issue fire and fireworks restrictions as needed. Visit the Utah State Fire Marshal's website at <http://publicsafety.utah.gov/firemarshal> for updates.

- Keep at least 30 feet from any residence, dwelling, structure, tree, power line, or overhead obstruction.
- Be aware of wind speed and direction before igniting aerial devices. Once ignited, aerial devices cannot be stopped; they will continue to fire each shot until all shots are spent.
- You will be held responsible if your fireworks land and start a fire.
- Do not use illegal fireworks: firecrackers, m-80s, cherry bombs, bottle rockets, roman candles, single or reloadable mortars, ground salutes.

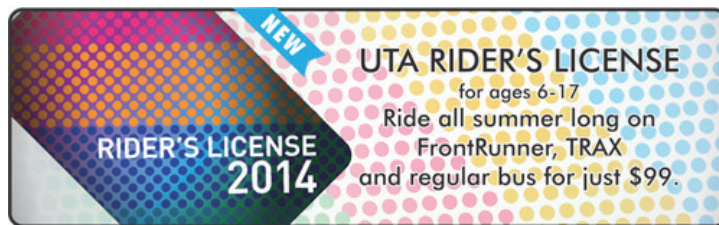

Free Summer Recreation Activities at Mound Fort Jr High

Ogden City Rec offers a number of summertime activities for youth. Try these activities for free at Mound Fort Jr High, 1396 Liberty Ave, throughout the summer.

Daytime activities for kids age 8 to 12 from 10am to 11:30am. Session 1 (June 2 – July 3) offers dance on Mondays, martial arts on Tuesdays, healthy eating on Wednesdays, and speed and endurance training on Mondays and Wednesdays. Session 2 (July 7 – Aug 4) offers racquet sports on Mondays, mountain biking on Tuesdays, hiking and rock climbing on Wednesdays, and water sports on Fridays.

Evening activities offered June 2 – Aug 4 include dodge ball on Thursdays 10pm to 11:30pm for kids age 8 to 12 and introduction to sports on Tuesdays and Thursdays 6pm to 7:30pm for kids age 6 to 10.

Emergency preparedness message

Basic knowledge of medical, first aid, and poison control are good every day skills. And in an emergency, these skills are essential.

First Aid preparation for your emergency kit:

- Keep an extra 30-day supply of life-sustaining medications in case pharmacy access becomes limited.
- Keep an updated list of all medications and doses for each person in your household—do not rely on doctor's records as they may not be available. Include medical histories too in your emergency kit.
- If you or someone close to you has a disability or special need, determine the extra steps you will need to take to care for that person during an emergency. Sign up now at the Special Needs Registry (<http://specialneedsutah.org>) to help responders plan for special needs in your area.
- Take time now to learn basic first aids skills, including CPR. In the event of a disaster, it may take extra time for medical help to arrive and your immediate action may save a life.
- Include in your 72-hour kit an assortment of bandages, ointments, gauze pads, hot/cold packets, tweezers, scissors, sanitizers, non-prescription pain relievers, stomach remedies, etc.

Know what to do in the event of chemical poisoning:

- The most common home chemical emergencies involve small children eating medicines. Keep all medicines, cosmetics, cleaning products, and other household chemicals out of sight and out of reach of children. Don't forget to lock up those colorful highly concentrated packets of laundry and dishwasher detergent that look like candy and are squishy look like a toy.
- If a child has eaten or drank a non-food substance, find the containers immediately and call the Poison Control Center at 1-800-222-1222 or call 9-1-1. Follow their instructions carefully. The first aid advice offered on containers may not be appropriate. Do not give anything by mouth unless advised by a medical professional.
- Program the Poison Control Center into your cell phone or place the number near or on your home phone: 1-800-222-1222

Reserve a pavilion at one of our many City parks for your next party. Restrooms and playgrounds are open to the public, but reserving a pavilion ensures shade and tables for your group. Choose *morning* (one hour before sunrise until 2 p.m.), *afternoon* (3 p.m. until one hour after sunset), or *all day* rental. Refundable \$100 cleaning deposit plus \$50 fee (or more for larger parks). No alcohol; no vehicles on the grass. Noise ordinances enforced; 200 people or more requires a special event permit.
