## Ogden and the Community Renewable Energy Agency

**The Community Renewable Energy Program (CREP) was introduced in the 2019 Utah Legislative Session as an opportunity for cities to work together to become 100% carbon neutral by the year 2030.**

### How is Ogden involved?

By a 5-2 vote, the Ogden City Council recently adopted a resolution to enter into an Interlocal Cooperation Agreement for the program. This means Ogden City will have a seat at the table for Phase One, as it works with other Utah cities, Rocky Mountain Power, and other organizations to develop a rate structure for review by the Public Services Commission. In addition, Ogden City will pay \$35,738 associated with costs of the Phase One process. Council Member Angela Choberka of District 1 has been appointed to represent Ogden City on the Community Renewable Energy Board, along with Management Services Director, Mara Brown, as an alternate.

### What's next?

Once the rate structure study is complete, the Council will once again evaluate whether or not Ogden City will continue its participation in the program. Consideration will take place in early 2022.

## Disposing of Fall Leaves

**When leaves start to fall, it will be time to start thinking about what to do with them.** Be aware while raking leaves

this fall that it is a violation of illegal dumping and waterway blocking ordinances to sweep or push leaves into the gutter or onto the street. Fallen leaves can plug storm drains and will cause ice dams to form in the gutters when the weather freezes. Keep the gutter in front of your home clean. Dispose of green waste from seasonal yard cleanup

such as branches, leaves, and grass clippings at Ogden City's Green Waste Facility (1845 Monroe Blvd). Residents who are unable to take their leaves to the Green Waste Facility should consider asking relatives, neighbors, or friends to assist them.

## Emergency Preparedness Message: Plan For Pets

### Don't forget about family pets when making emergency plans.

Animals will require the same basics of survival, particularly food and water, that other household members require in emergency preparedness kits. Use the following tips to provide for them.

- **Keep pets properly identified.** Microchip identification, after collars and tags, is one of the best ways to ensure owners are reunited with pets. Keep the microchip registration up-to-date, and include at least one emergency number of someone who resides out of the immediate area.
  - **Plan a pet-friendly place to stay.** Plan in advance for shelter alternatives that can host pets in an emergency, such as loved ones or friends outside of the immediate area. Never leave a pet behind during an evacuation.
  - **Prepare an emergency kit for each animal.** Stock up on pet items needed during a disaster including a one-week supply of food and water, medication, and copies of vaccination records. Rotate supplies to keep them fresh.
  - **Prepare safety and first aid supplies.** Have a carrier or leash for each animal to prevent them from escaping in a panic. Keep a pet first aid kit and identify emergency veterinary facilities outside the immediate area.
  - **Plan for temporary confinement.** Physical structures, like walls, fences, and barns may be destroyed during a disaster. Have a plan for keeping animals safely confined, including a tie-out, crate, or kennel.
