21st Annual Ogden Marathon, May 21

The America First Ogden Marathon, produced by the GOAL Foundation, is back live and in-person for its 21st year running.

Register online to participate in the race, or join the celebration by attending free community events and activities held during marathon weekend.

Participate:

This year, the Ogden Marathon is introducing a new 12K distance (~7.4 miles), starting near The Oaks in Ogden Canyon and following the remainder of the marathon course. Other distances include a 5K, half marathon, relay marathon, and full marathon (Boston Qualifier). A "KidsK" run will be held on Saturday afternoon (12:30 p.m.) during the Finish Line Festival on 25th Street.

Community Events:

The GOAL Fun & Fitness Expo is on Friday, May 20, from 10:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. at the Weber County Field House. Entry is free for all. Attendees can participate in giveaways and sample products and services related to sports, health, and overall wellness. Come early for a Shake Out Run at 9:00 a.m. prior to the ribbon-cutting and opening ceremony at 9:45 a.m. The Autoliv Finish Line Festival is held during the race on Saturday, May 21, from 7:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. downtown at the Ogden Municipal Gardens. Enjoy free kids activities, live music, food trucks, vendors, and more as we come together as a community to celebrate the many accomplishments of Ogden Marathon participants.

As part of this strategic change, the billing system will be replaced with a more robust system appropriate for a city of our size. It will also allow us to automate many manual processes, reduce paper, and become more efficient. Customers who are currently on autopay or those who typically pay in person will not be affected. April is Fair Housing Month

The Fair Housing Act prohibits housing discrimination because of race, color, national origin, religion, sex, familial status, and disability.

The Act protects people from discrimination when they are renting or buying a home, getting a mortgage, seeking housing assistance, or engaging in other housing-related activities.

Landlords, real estate agents, lenders, insurance companies, and condominiums, cooperative and homeowner associations must not discriminate because of one's membership in a protected class. If you believe you have been discriminated against in violation of the federal fair housing laws, you can file a complaint with HUD at:
