Bonfire Yard Cleanup

Ogden Fire Department will allow residents to burn plant items from their yards March 30 – May 30, as environmental conditions allow.

Burn permits are required and must be obtained *prior* to burning.

Apply for a permit online at www.ogdencity.com/burnpermit or call 801-629-8074.

Permits are \$5, and the requested burn site will be inspected and approved by the Fire Department prior to a permit being issued.

Items allowed to be burned are clippings, bushes, plants, and tree prunings incident to property cleanup and must be thoroughly dry. Absolutely no trash, rubbish, or tires are allowed.

Free trees for parking strip areas

Ogden's tree-lined streets establish the character of our neighborhoods, and the trees we plant today will be enjoyed by generations to come.

Each year the City provides a Tree Nursery so residents can get a free tree to plant in their parking strip that matches the needs for the yard and the plan for the street.

Beginning April 2, trees will be given away on a first-come-first-served basis, limit one per household, at Ogden's Green Waste Facility located at 1845 Monroe Blvd. Residents must provide information about overhead power lines, the width of their parking strip, and the lot location, as well as a current Ogden Water bill and picture ID.

The Green Waste facility also has for sale an abundance of premium compost \$3/bag or \$15/yard, wood chips \$10/yard, and mulch \$7/yard.

Free dump passes for Ogden City residents

To help residents dispose of items not allowed in the Dial-A-Dumpster program or the Green Waste facility, Ogden City is offering citizens two free dump passes to the Weber County Transfer Station. Passes are available through June 30 at the Public Works building, 113 West 29th St. Must have a Water account with Ogden City to qualify, please bring picture ID.

Water storage for emergency preparation

Water is essential to survival and required in any emergency kit. Work to build a water supply to meet your family's needs during an emergency.

Store at least one gallon of water, per person, per day for up to two weeks
Add an additional gallon per day, per person, for sanitation needs

Use food-grade water storage containers, available at surplus or camping supplies stores or simply reuse two-liter soft drink bottles. Don't use plastic jugs or cardboard containers that have had milk or fruit juice in them as the milk protein and fruit sugars don't fully rinse out providing an environment for bacterial growth in your stored water.

If you choose to use commercially bottled water, store the containers in a cool, dark place and observe the use by date as those containers will begin to break down over time. In addition to storing water, be sure to add water purification tablets to your kit so you can purify more water as needed during an emergency.
