Heat Can Cause “Micro-Bubbles” in Tap Water

If tap water comes out looking cloudy or milky during the summer, air bubbles due to heat may be the reason. The cloudiness is likely due to tiny air bubbles in the water.

Like any bubble, the air rises to the top and dissipates into the air.

The water that enters your home can be quite cold. Cold water holds more air than warm water. When this cold water enters your home plumbing, it is exposed to significantly warmer temperatures. This change in temperature causes dissolved oxygen to escape in the form of “micro-bubbles.” These bubbles can give water a cloudy appearance. If a glass of this water is allowed to sit for a short period of time the cloudy effect will dissipate. The air bubbles in the water are completely harmless.

Ogden City experiences much higher water demand during the summer heat and irrigation season. Ogden City's source water is very cold as it is drawn from deep within Pineview Reservoir. Higher water velocities in the summer months allow this water to reach a home's plumbing system at a very low temperature. Warm atmospheric conditions create a larger change in temperature when this water leaves the home's plumbing. These conditions lead to more air bubbles being suspended in the water during summer months. Please contact the Ogden City Water department office for any questions regarding cloudy water.

Emergency Preparedness Message: First Aid

- **Prepare a first aid kit** Have items that can help stop bleeding, prevent infection, and assist in decontamination in your 72-hour emergency kit. Hospitals and emergency services will be overwhelmed during a disaster, and these supplies can help when professional treatment is delayed.
- **Get emergency training.** Knowing how to treat non-life-threatening injuries can make a difference during a disaster. Consider taking a first aid and/or a CPR class from the local American Red Cross or similar organization.
- **Be the help until help arrives.** FEMA has developed training that teaches how to take action through simple steps and potentially save a life before professional help arrives. This program encourages the public to take five steps during an emergency:

1. Call 9-1-1
2. Protect the injured from harm
3. Stop bleeding
4. Position the injured so they can breathe
5. Provide comfort

Weber County's Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) welcomes volunteers and provides training on basic first aid and other preparedness skills. The next class begins September 6 and registration can be done online.
