Ogden Twilight 2019 Begins June 6

The 2019 Ogden Twilight concert series begins June 6, with ten shows scheduled through September. Keep the following information in mind while preparing to attend.

- **Buy tickets ahead of time.** Each concert has a different ticket price, so buying Twilight passes ahead of time will help to avoid unexpected costs. Tickets for each individual show can be purchased online through 24tix.com and in person at The Corner (2501 Washington Blvd). All concerts will continue as scheduled, rain or shine.
- **Use alternative transportation.** Parking downtown will be limited, so it's recommended to carpool or ride public transit. The UTA frontrunner is free with a concert ticket and a bike valet service will be available at the amphitheater.
- **Prepare for hot weather.** Dressing light, wearing sunscreen and bringing an empty bottle to refill at water stations inside the venue will improve the concert experience in the summer heat.
- **Bring cash.** Most of the food, drink and merchandise vendors inside will be cash only. An ATM will be available with a service charge.

Four Major Summer Events in One Weekend

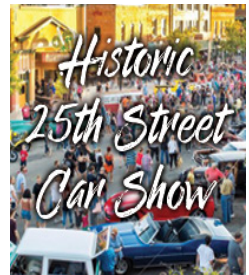
June 7-9 will bring a variety of summer celebration opportunities to downtown. Attend the June First Friday Art Stroll, the 17th Annual Historic 25th Street Car Show, the inaugural Ogden UnCon pop culture convention and the 15th annual Ogden Arts Festival all in one weekend. There will be a wide variety of cultural and art events for community members of all ages to explore.

- **Historic 25th Street Car Show, June 7.** The 17th Annual Historic 25th Street Car Show will be held Friday from 5– 9 p.m. This show typically showcases more than 400 vehicles lining along Historic 25th Street from Wall Avenue to Washington Boulevard. Winners are selected by sponsors, business owners and Ogden City officials. Car show registration must be completed online, as no on-site registration will be accepted this year. The street will reopen to traffic after the awards ceremony at 8:45 p.m.

- **Ogden UnCon, June 7-9.** Ogden UnCon is Ogden's own untamed and unconventional pop culture convention for fans of every kind. This event features celebrity guests and panels, cosplay contests, 24-hr gaming, artist workshops, live concerts, VIP pass holder rewards and over 300 hours of programming during the weekend. The convention begins at 10 a.m. Friday-Sunday and activities continue into the late afternoon or evening, depending on each day's unique schedule. Ticket sales have been capped at 6,000 to minimize line wait time and increase access. Ticket prices begin at \$35 and passes can be bought downtown at The Corner (2501 Washington Blvd) for a 15% discount.

Emergency Preparedness: Code Red

Code Red is a free community notification system used by Ogden City to send critical and time-sensitive communications. Users register their cell phone number to a physical home address online, then emergency information notifications will be sent to their phone regarding their neighborhood no matter where they are. Downloading the Code Red app onto a cell phone will also give users notifications about their current location. Notifications may include information on missing persons/children, natural disasters, evacuation notices, wildfire alerts, public health crises and other announcements requiring emergency preparedness.
